Los Medranos: A community ripe for building up.

Thank you for taking a few minutes to journey with us as we look back through 2018. So much has transpired over the last year in Nicaragua and beyond. We thank God that lives continue to be changed even during times of turmoil!

Mauricio Manzanarez, our fantastic Operations Manager of the Skylark Retreat Centre, wrote these words at the close of the year: *“It is just amazing to be typing these lines today, since when we look back to several months ago, we weren’t sure if we would be able to sit down again behind our desks, due to the uprising socio-political crisis that our country was going thru. Now we can look back and although the crisis is not over yet, we have seen God’s hand and protection in the middle of the conflict.”*

This was certainly a unique year during which:

- **33 employees and volunteers of the Jinotepe fire department were trained** by 8 professional and in-training Canadian Paramedics in early April
- **389 community members were served** by 7 medical students and professionals in late April
- **5 young men were trained in basic electricity** by Allan, our head of maintenance at Skylark
- **5 students completed 2 multi-class beginner-level English training sessions**
- **10 women attended 30 classes** over 9 months learning new art and baking skills
- **30 children** (and parents of the youngest) attended educational and socializing classes, all with a Christ-based focus, specifically geared to their age group
- **2694 individuals** attended Christian-based events hosted by **35 groups**
- **194 households (encompassing 775 individuals)** participated in interviews in completion of the Los Medranos area survey conducted in April and May, which sets the stage for immediate and future program development
- **26 staff** were employed in Nicaragua through 2018 in a country devastated by job losses in the hundreds of thousands

Responsibility: We work hard to maximize the donated funds that reach those who most need them. Approximately 80% of funds are directed into in-country projects and programs, with the remainder retained for essential operations in Canada.

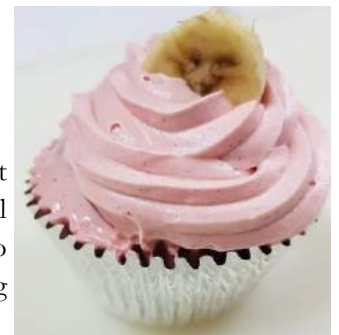

Why we do what we do

Approximately **67%** of those living in the Los Medranos area **subsist on less than \$9 per day**. There are **no local health care centres** in the immediate area and transportation options to larger centres are limited. **93% do not have permanent access to clean water**. Children make up 1/3 of the population.
