Thank you for taking a few minutes to journey with us as we look back through 2019. We thank God that lives continue to be changed as the country continues to recover from the political strife of 2018!

As Mauricio Manzanarez, Operations Manager of the Skylark Retreat Centre, writes regarding the past year: *“[the political crisis of 2018] is showing up in different faces. Unemployment, exile, heavier taxes, more restrictions on free speech, interaction between Government offices and NGOs, etc. But God has certainly shown His Glory in the middle of all of this. We pray that He may continue restoring the relationships, the economic situation of the country, and that He can touch the hearts of those who make decisions.”*



2019 was somewhat of a rebuilding year during which:

- **Over 30 employees and volunteers of the Jinotepe, Masatepe and Diramba fire departments were trained**, in May, by 12 professional and in-training Canadian Paramedics
- **72 participants took part in training for Christian Leaders**, led by the October Pastoral team
- The fall **Construction team** of 11, alongside staff, tackled a number of Nicaragua Ministry of Labour-designated projects
- **328 community members were served** in November by 4 medical professionals and additional volunteers
- **16 patients with chronic conditions** received bi-monthly assessment, treatment and medication during the pilot phase of the on-site medical clinic
- **7 women completed classes** over 9 months learning new art and baking skills
- **37 children** (and parents of the youngest) attended educational and socializing classes, all with a Christ-based focus, specifically geared to their age group
- **3016 individuals** attended Christian-based events hosted by **46 local Nicaraguan-based groups**
- **26 local staff received employment income** in a still-recovering environment
- **20 participants on 2 teams rode** in support of Threefold Ministries' programs in the annual Ride for Refuge
- **Necessary capital improvements** were completed

Responsibility: We work diligently to see that approximately 80% of donated funds are directed into projects and programs in Nicaragua, with the remainder retained for essential operations in Canada.
