

The purpose of the mission was to empower local fire station employees and volunteers by providing them with training in needed and relevant first-response skills, enabling them to have increased effectiveness to service the people of the local communities.

The week was fantastic for the over 30 participants, many of whom were receiving training for the first time. The youngest trainee, and active fire-station volunteer, was only 13 years old. We already know that skills have been put to practical use. New! Medical Clinic

There are four primary chronic conditions that visiting medical teams find when serving the population of Los Medranos; diabetes, hypertension, cardiac and thyroid issues arise continually and consistently. The survey completed last year highlighted the desire of the community for a local clinic.

We are responding! The office spaces have been reconfigured and a medical clinic is now in the works to serve those with the greatest need. It is set to launch in July, staffed part-time by a local doctor and an assistant. Up to 40 select patients will receive regular check-ups, much-needed medication, personal health supplies,

clean drinking water and educational material. This clinic will not replace the need for medical teams, but will allow those teams to monitor progress, see more patients and contribute more broadly to community

health. The goal is that there be a marked improvement in patient health resulting from regular care.

We are excited! Watch for more information and regular updates.

“Best Start in Christ” programming is full and exciting, with 38 children enrolled for the current year and a great group of women learning skills that are being carried forward into the
